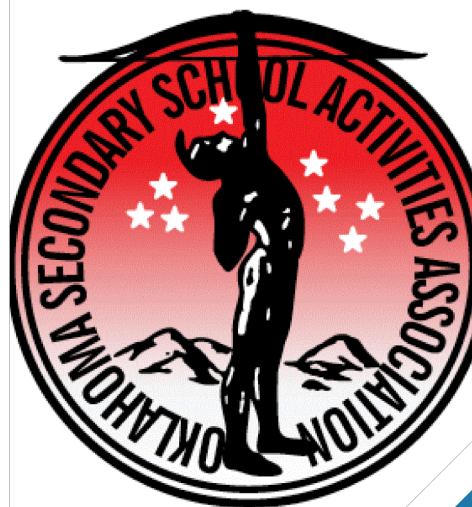

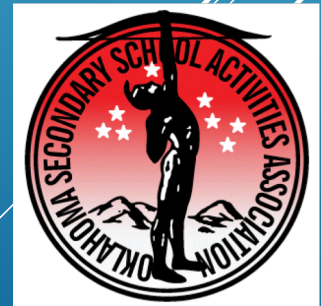
Hospitality goes along way!



ELIGIBILITY, POLICIES AND COACHES REQUIREMENTS

ELIGIBILITY RECORD FORM

- ▶ The record form is designed to be a tool to aid you in determining athletic eligibility for students at your school.
- ▶ All questions have a YES or NO answer.
- ▶ All students entering 7th, 8th and 9th grade should fill out a Student Record Form each year.

AGE

- ▶ A student that is 14 years of age for 7th grade, 15 years of age for eighth grade, 16 years of age for ninth grade, prior to September 1 is considered to be overage.
- ▶ An overage hardship should be filed prior to allowing the student to participate at the 7th, 8th or 9th grade level if the student is overage.
- ▶ Reasons for a student to be overage could be due to repeating a grade in elementary school, a language barrier, or entering kindergarten at 6 years of age.

ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY DURING A SEMESTER

- ▶ A student must be passing all subjects in which he/she is enrolled during a semester.
- ▶ If a student is not passing all subjects on the day of the grade check, he/she will be placed on probation for the next one-week period.
- ▶ If a student is still failing one or more classes, during the next week on the grade check day, he/she will be ineligible to participate during the next one-week period.

ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY FOR A NEW STUDENT

- ▶ A student must be passing all courses at the time of enrollment at a new school.
- ▶ Students admitted with failing grades must sit 3 weeks to gain eligibility.

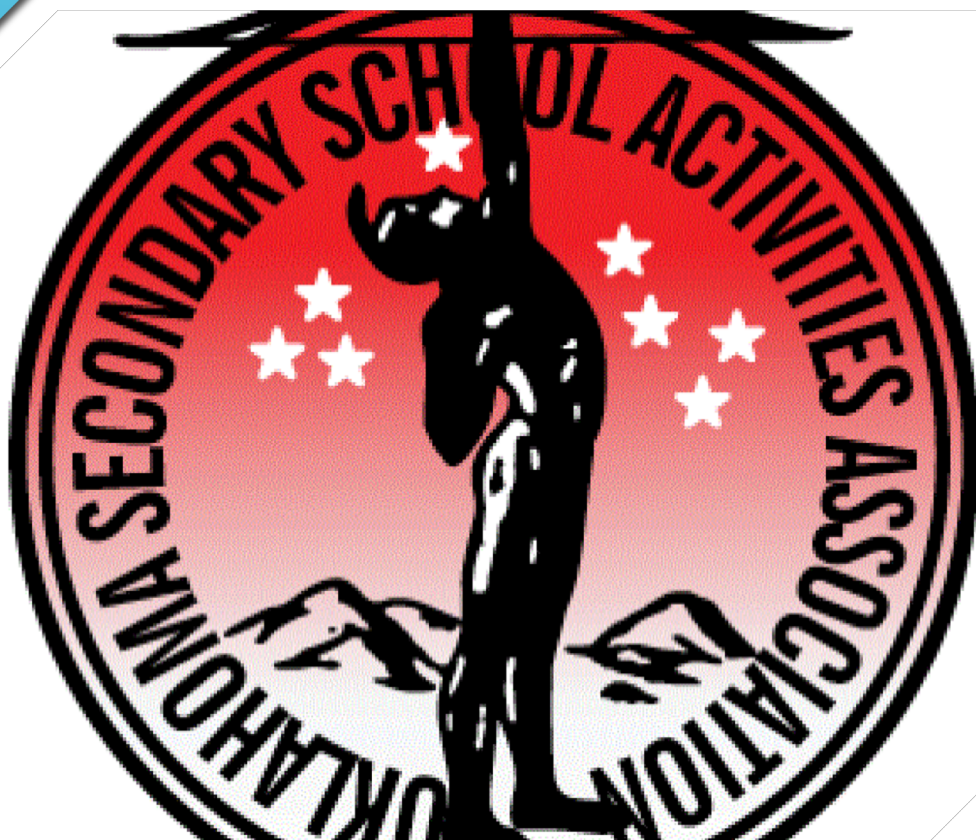
RESIDENCE ELIGIBILITY

- ▶ Any student not living with their parent or legal guardian must complete a Changing Schools form prior to participation.
- ▶ The residence rule does not apply to non-athletic activities.
- ▶ Legal guardian=court appointed.

RESIDENCE ELIGIBILITY

- ▶ For the purpose of establishing or maintaining athletic eligibility, a student's parents or legal guardian may only maintain one residence.
- ▶ A family that moves into another residence with another family or person(s) while continuing to own or rent the former residence is also considered to be in a **dual residence** situation.
- ▶ Once the paperwork has been approved, then the student would be eligible for participate at the 7th, 8th or 9th grade level. A student not in compliance with the dual residence requirements would not be eligible at the varsity level.

Legal guardian=court appointed



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
