



2021 OSSAA Basketball Play-Off Guidelines for District, Regional and Area

The OSSAA in conjunction with the Governor's Office and the State Department of Health established the maximum capacity at 50% for each facility during all sessions of the play-offs. The following minimum mandates will be implemented at each play-off site. Any host with more restrictive requirements should notify the OSSAA as well as the schools participating at their site. School administration is responsible for compliance with all mandates.

1. Facial coverings/masks will be required for all coaches, spectators and any participants not actively involved in the contest.
2. Social distancing practices will be observed.
3. Facilities will be cleaned between contests/sessions unless the same two schools are participating in the next contest.
4. Seating will be designated to meet the 50% capacity mandate.

Game times: All game times are set by OSSAA. There will be two sessions:

Afternoon session games at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m.

Evening session games at 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.

Clearing the facility between contests: The facility will be cleared between contests of a two-game session unless the same two schools are involved in the session. (The second game participants in the session come from the same schools as the first game participants)

Ticket prices: Tickets will be \$7 per session and will be sold at the site. Anyone school age or above will be required to purchase a ticket. If the facility is cleared within a session a ticket stub must be presented to re-enter the second game of a session. Sites may use a stamp in place of a ticket stub.

OSSAA Passes: A limited number of OSSAA passes will be admitted to a play-off contest. The number of passes allowed will be at the discretion of the host site and based on 50% capacity.

Spirit (Cheer/Pom): Each school is limited to 10 spirit squad members. All squad members are required to wear a mask.

Participation for a team halted due to COVID: Should a team qualifying for the next scheduled round of the play-off series become unable to participate in the contest due to COVID, the opponent of that team will automatically advance to the next scheduled round of the play-off series. Example: Team A is scheduled to play Team B; Team A is unable to play due to COVID; Team B automatically advances.



2021 OSSAA Wrestling Post Season Guidelines for Regionals, State and Dual State

The OSSAA, the Governor's Office and the State Department of Health are engaged in conversations regarding the capacity levels that will be permitted during the play-offs.

The regional sites will be providing vouchers for participating teams. These vouchers will allow the holder to purchase a ticket at the door.

The State Fairgrounds Arena will be selling online tickets only for the State Tournament.

The Stride Bank Event Center will only be selling tickets at the door for the Dual State Championships.

The following minimum mandates will be implemented at each post season site:

1. Facial coverings/masks will be required.
2. Social distancing practices will be observed.
3. Facilities will be cleaned throughout and between sessions.
4. Seating will be designated to meet the capacity mandates or site-specific mandates per local school district.

Session Times: All start times or session times are set by OSSAA.

Girls regionals are scheduled to begin at 10:00 am

Boys regionals are scheduled to begin at 11:00 am.

The regional tournaments are single session events and will be wrestled in one day.

The State Tournament will be a three- day event with two sessions per day. All classes will complete the tournament in one day.

Girls State Tournament All Classes—Thursday February 25

Class 4A and Class 5A Boys State Tournament—Friday February 26

Class 3A and Class 6A Boys State Tournament—Saturday February 27

Class 4A and 5A Dual State Tournament—Friday March 12

Class 3A and 6A Dual State Tournament—Saturday March 13.

Clearing the facility between sessions: The facilities will be cleared between sessions of any two- session or multi session event.

Ticket prices: Tickets will be \$7 per session for the regional tournaments and will be sold at the site. Tickets will be \$10 per session for the state tournament and dual state tournament. Anyone school age or above will be required to purchase a ticket. If the facility is cleared within a session a ticket stub must be presented to re-enter. Sites may use a stamp in place of a ticket stub.

Spirit (Cheer/Pom): Spirit groups are not permitted at any Regional Site.

Information regarding the State Tournaments will be sent to schools prior to the event.
